Background and objectives

Energy Efficiency Obligation Schemes (EEOS) delivered one third of the [cumulative energy savings over 2014-2020](#) reported by the Member States to the energy savings obligation set in the EU Energy Efficiency Directive (former Article 7, now Article 8). They were the policy instrument with the largest share of cumulative savings, before energy and CO₂ taxes (17%) and financing schemes and instruments (14%). **EEOS therefore represent a major part in the implementation of the EED energy savings obligation**, with [14 Member States having an EEOS](#) in place for the 2021-2030 period, whose now 4 EEOS including white certificates trading.

This workshop will contribute to share experience among countries and stakeholders:

- What have been the latest results and lessons learnt among EEOS in Europe?
- What are the main recent changes?
- What are further key changes expected from the new Energy Efficiency Directive entered into force in October 2023?
- How do stakeholders of EEOS reach and support final customers?
- How do stakeholders contribute to tackle energy poverty?
